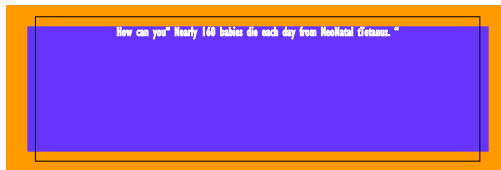
# Project Eliminate

The purpose of this project is to be able to provide the Tetanus shot to women in these 3rd world countries. In giving them the tetanus shot they themselves are protected from Teanus for a life time as well as

any of their unborn children. Each mother will need to take a series of three shots in order to be completely protected.. The series of three shots will cost approximately \$ 1.80.
