Our club through a donation to the “Eliminate Project” which was formed in order to help protect a women and their unborn children in 3rd world countries from Neo-Natal Tetnas.

This year we are proud to name:

Mr. Scott Shookman as a:

“Walter Zeller Fellow”

The Foundation was established in 1940 through a donation of 25 Canadian Silver Dollars which launched the worldwide foundation which is a Multi-Million Dollar Organization.

Now let me tell you a little about the recipient of this award.

Mr. Scott Shookman a man who is not only dedicated to family and friends but his community as well joined Portage Lakes Kiwanis in April of 1984 and he joined the Lakes Senior Housing Kiwanis Towers in 1999. Followed one year later by being elected as President.

In 15 years Scott only missed one meeting. His project to reduce the interest rate the Towers paid was a great success. The rate was 9 ¼% in 1981 and was reduced to 5.4% in 2007. This project took several years in addition to the filing of hundreds of government forms.

Scott worked with Herb Newman and Rick Nixon of Summit Management on the day to day operations of the Kiwanis Senior Towers which resulted Grades of 100% from HUD in the annual Government Inspections. This is a task that is rare and unheard of in today's time.

Scott's effort is to be celebrated for providing 45 Seniors with a 1st Class living area at a rate of approximately \$ 290.00 per month. Kiwanis Senior Towers is just one

example of what Mr. Shookman has done with his dedication and commitment to this community.

Several members of PLK were unable to attend tonight's dedication but that did not stop them from sending their comments from the South – North to the Civic Center:

Mr. Tom Longworth – one of the founding members of PLK had this to say: *If you want something done and done right give the job to the busiest person around..... Scott is that person he gets things done right and on time. Scott's dedication along with a friendly smile will "Persuade" anyone to pitch in and help.*

Mr. Tom Burge – Past PLK President had this to say: *Scott was already a member when I joined PLK some 29 years ago. Scott has always been involved in many community and Kiwanis projects over the years – from obtaining new blinds for the towers, refinancing the towers loan, resurfacing the civic center parking lot to Santa Delviery, Rose Day and more. He even checked my hot tub one winter while Polly and I were snowbirding. "Scott we salute you for your dedication in making Portage Lakes Kiwanis and the entire Portage Lakes Community a better place to live. I am honored to call you MY Friend – Tom Burge."*

Mr. Jay Feldman - *I first met Scott after joining PLK. We worked on many projects together, including Camp Y Noah Stream, Picnic Table Construcion, Bunkbed Building, painting. When I was first diagnosed with a Brain Aneurysm, complicated by a stroke – Scott would visit me in the Cleveland Clinic and was a tremendous help to my wife Ellen and my family during my long-term recovery. I don't know anyone who that needed help from Scott that wasn't Helped! "I love you Man! I wish I could be there to honor YOU and your accomplishments!!"*

Vicki Kepnes - *Scott has always had PLK and the Kiwanis Civic Center & Towers in his heart. He worked to insure we had the best "Options" available on projects such as Upgrading the Civic Center Facilities, Resurfacing the parking lot,*

Lighting with more cost effective technology. Scott would always come up with that "Special Contact" to make things happen. We loved watching the Fireworks with friends and family at Scott's house. Scott and Becky opened their home to all their friends for this event.

Mr. Sam Reynolds –Retired Manchester Schools Superintendent

– Scott's undying dedication to not only PLK & The community but the schools as well. Through Scott's efforts he had a concession stand put at the track and then the roof had to be put on. Scott taught Mr. James France, Myself and several others to roof that day as we all worked on it together. Scott's dedication to community goes into the schools also. Several Manchester employees received Awards due to the letters of recommendation that Mr. Shookman wrote for them. Sometimes those letters went out without the knowledge that Scott was writing it. He just did it because that is who he is. Scott worked with the Manchester Key Club when PLK sold Roses and he also helped deliver them for many years. Scott's dedication to the school system is amazing – He serves as chairman of several committees and his wife Becky also serves as chairman.

I personally want to Thank you Scott for the dedication to community, schools, family and friends.
