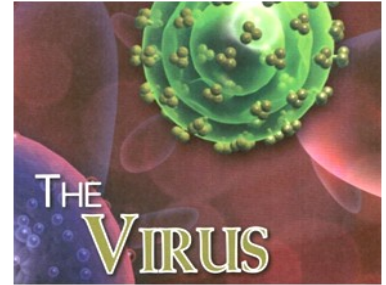
#### **To all Board Members**

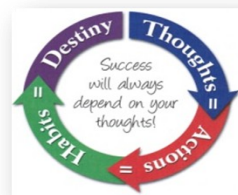
