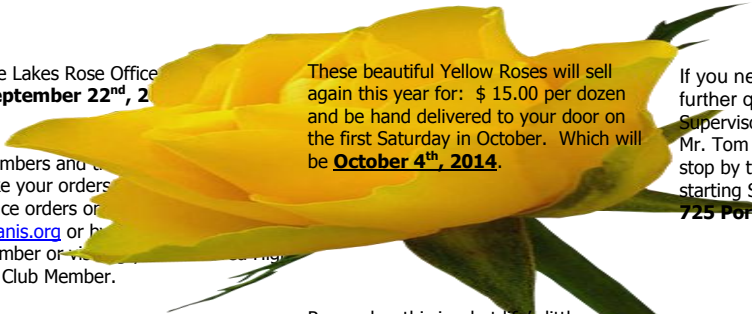

Guest Speaker:
Mr Keith Shy from Summit Metro Parks – was our guest speaker for the evening.

The Summit Metro Parks was established in 1921

The mission of the Metro Parks is to acquire, conserve and manage natural resources and to provide the public with safe, outdoor recreational & educational opportunities in the local parks

They currently manage 10,500 acres, 14 developed parks 6 conservation areas in addition to the 125 miles of trails which

includes 21.5 miles of towpath trails that wind through the Ohio & Erie Canal.

The estimated annual number of visitors was 4.5 million. In 2011 the Metro Parks celebrated their 90th year.

The majority of the Metro parks are located in Summit County in the Ohio & Erie canalway National Heritage Area.

Visitors at **Cascade Metro Park** can see two of the oldest structures in Akron: The **Mustill House & Store** which are maintained by the **Cascade Locks Park Association.**

Chukery Trail gives hikers a glimpse of : The Indian Signal

Tree. This is a 300 yr old Burr Oak that was reportedly planted by American Indians to signal the southernmost part of the Cuyahoga River as well as the beginning of the eight-mile Portage Trail.

F.A. Seiberling Nature Realm is a special park dedicated to the employment and study of the natural world.

Harold S. Wagner the parks First Director-Secretary planted the first **Daffodil bulbs** in the late 1930's in the Furnace Run Metro Park. It is estimated that today there are approximately 30,000 – 40,000 Daffodils growing along that trail.

There are 110 miles of endless possibilities in the metro parks. You can discover American Culture, canal – era history.

And all this can be done by hiking with the family, biking on the tow path trails, and sometimes even by horseback.

Or take a scenic ride on the Railway through the Cuyahoga Valley.

Spring, Summer, Fall or Winter there is always something to do at the metro parks. From a family walk on a beautiful fall day. Experience the parks. teach the kids

about our area and enjoy nature at the same time as a family. To sled riding at the Goodyear Heights Metro Park on Newton in Goodyear Heights in the winter. For more detailed information please visit their website @ www.summitmetroparks.org
